Typically we use the past simple (saw) for events in the past and the past perfect (had seen) for events further in the past. For example, you could say: I had seen.

Error (Forbidden)

Saw is the PAST TENSE of the verb see, and usually comes immediately after NOUNS and PRONOUNS. Generally, seen is used alongside have, has, had, was or were in a sentence to make COMPOUND VERBS. USAGE: saw: This word is a stand-alone VERB.
